~From The Pastor's Desk~

Loving Jesus, Loving People means:

The Eagle River Church of the Nazarene, as a member of the international Christian community, desires to be a holy people, anchored in God's Word for the purpose of worship, praise and the glorification of our Lord and Savior. We desire to reach the lost for Jesus Christ, establish and nurture new relationships, and assist in the discipling of all Christians.

I think the hardest emotion to convey is gratitude. It is perhaps the easiest emotion to pick up on, but the hardest to convey. I am going to blame this on the inadequacy of the English language. That is to say, I think our standard words for gratitude "thank you" are dreadfully inefficient. If I were given a soda on a hot day, I would say to the giver, "thank you."

An appropriate response to be sure, but these are the same words I would use to convey gratitude to one who saved my life...the two situations seem to demand different responses, yet our language does not have them.

You may be wondering where I am going with this. Well, I have been struggling over the past couple of weeks how to best convey the gratitude that Jennifer and I feel for the support and prayers of our church family. Suffice it to say 'thank you' does not seem to do the trick in my mind. We are grateful, we appreciate the thoughts and prayers and yet we (or maybe just I) cannot seem to convey just how grateful we

dreadfully inadequate, we thank you from the bottom of our hearts.

As many of you read in the email I sent out immediately after the miscarriage, we felt the presence of God with us every minute we were in the hospital. Through this time, I have come to realize how important the abiding presence of God is in our lives. It is certainly easy to overlook God's presence and provision when things are good. Often we give lip service to the fact that we know, intellectually at least, that God is always present. However, when things are bad...when we are in the depths of despair, what keeps us going is that presence of God.

I have noticed, that it is not the feeling that everything is going to be 'ok' that keeps me going. Often times, this is not the

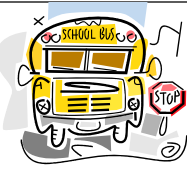

The Alabaster Offering provides funds for property and buildings around the world. It gives a sense of permanence, the attitude that the Church of the Nazarene intends to "put down roots." Eighty percent of the money is used in world mission areas, and twenty percent goes to multicultural congregations in the United States and Canada. Alabaster funds help provide land for most Work & Witness projects. The entire offering goes toward the construction of churches, schools, medical facilities, and homes for missionaries and national workers.

How Are Alabaster Offerings Received?

The Alabaster Offering gets to the mission field via several avenues. The most widely used is the Alabaster Box. Individuals are challenged to regularly contribute the cost of items they desire but do not need. The boxes also serve as reminders to pray for those people who will benefit from Alabaster buildings.

In September and February, the money is collected. Sometimes a "march offering" is received with individuals carrying their boxes to the front of the church and pouring the money into a large offering container. The way an offering is received is as varied as the world areas in which the Church of the Nazarene has a presence; however, it is always accompanied with a spirit of rejoicing.

Many churches receive regular offerings throughout the year that are designated as Alabaster funds. (This is often a part of the Faith

Promise plan for missions giving.) However, the semi-annual offerings should still be received, allowing opportunity for giving by those not participating in other ways.

Alabaster should be well-publicized. All ages are encouraged to participate with leaders educating local churches as to the need for centers of holiness evangelism around the world.

The History of Alabaster

Following World War II, the critical need for buildings and land in the world mission areas of the Church of the Nazarene was presented to the General NMI Council. The Council asked Rev. Elizabeth Roby Venum, a member of the group, to submit a plan that would generate giving for this need.

Rev. Venum knew if God wanted those buildings, He would provide the plan. On the return trip from

Kansas City, God gave her His plan of giving "love" gifts. It was modeled after the sacrifice of the woman who anointed Jesus' head with expensive perfume poured from an alabaster jar (Matthew 26:6-13).

The General NMI Council unanimously adopted the plan, and the first offering was received in 1949. Now, more than 50 years later, more than 7,300 projects have been purchased or built with more than \$79 million.

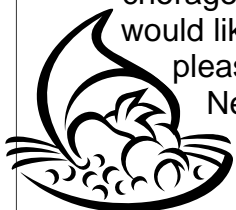


servicing on average 140 families per week with the Food Pantry and 130 families with the Mobile Food Pantry.

truth. Often times, at least from a physical or temporal perspective, things aren't ok. I cannot think of one tragic death that I would call 'ok.' Rather, what I noticed was that the mere presence of God with us made the difference. I imagined God sitting at the side of the bed, head buried in hands, weeping as we were weeping. I imagined God sitting beside the bed, holding our precious child, and weeping over her, just as we were.

God is pained when we are. That may or may not come as a surprise, but it is true. God does not remain unmoved by pain or even death. God is not stoic. After all, it is that love of God and infinite interest in creation, that caused God to become flesh. Jesus wept with Mary and Martha at the death of his friend Lazarus. Christ wept over

the city of Jerusalem who had constantly turned away from God and even killed those sent to bring her back.

I guess I say all of that, to say that God's presence has rarely been as real to me as it was during this terrible time. I knew God was there. I saw God in the actions of God's people, the church, as you cried with us. And to that I say, first of all, thanks be to God for God's presence amidst the pain. Secondly, I give thanks to God for you, who showed the love of Christ to us.
